Our current study of the various Christologies of the New Testament will extend until the 16th of September. On the 23rd of September we will begin a six week study (until October 28th) of writings of the New Testament Apocrypha. The Apocrypha consists of writings that were not deemed canonical by the various church councils that determined what would eventually form the Bible as we now find it. However, some of these writings have become quite popular in recent years, and they reveal the astounding diversity of interpretations of the lives of Jesus and Paul. Our study will focus on three of the most interesting and prominent works that do not appear in the New Testament: The Gospel of Thomas (9/23 and 9/30), The Gospel of Judas (10/7 and 10/14), and the Acts of Paul (10/21 and 10/28). All are welcome to attend this exciting study of these ancient and peculiar texts!
