Not only will we hear portions of Dan Forrest's Requiem for the Living in our All Saints' worship service at 11 a.m. on Sunday, November 6, Morningside Presbyterian's choir will combine with Central Presbyterian's choir that same afternoon at Central Presbyterian Church to sing the requiem in its entirety. This choral offering with orchestra is presented as part of the remembrance of all the saints who have passed through this life

into the next. All are invited to this free

Composed in 2013, Requiem for the Living is in five movements for chorus, orchestra, and soloists. Four of the five movements follow a traditional requiem format -Kyrie, Agnus Dei, Sanctus, and Lux Aeterna. The fifth movement, Vanitas Vanitatum, was chosen from the books of Job and Ecclesiastes — a most unusual choice for a requiem: All are from the dust...and the dust returns to the earth as it was. Vanity of vanities, all is vanity. This choice replaces the Catholic usage of "Dies Irae" - Day of Wrath, Day of Anger.






