I don't know about you but it's been a long Lent, so I am ready for that joyful good news. As we look toward Easter this year, we step into a season where we are called to look for the Risen Christ among us and to bear witness to that good news for others when we see God at work.

We've spent Lent in the heaviness of our broken world. We've lost a saint of the church. We've witnessed the world try to diminish the worth of beloved children of God. We've grieved another act of gun violence in our schools. And all of us have parts of our own stories that are broken and in need of God's grace. But amidst all that we have held during Lent, God's grace still breaks through.

Frederick Beuchner once wrote, "This is the world. Beautiful and terrible things will happen. Do not be afraid." And so as we walk this Holy Week together and look to Easter, may we sit in the tension of our broken world and God's redeeming, amazing, abundant grace in Christ.

When I was a campus minister, a student named Courtney stopped by my office nearly every day with two questions: "What was the best part of your last 24 hours?" and "Have you had a God-sighting this week?" Her simple questions became acts of profound proclamation of resurrection. Sometimes the God sightings were simple things--a hug from a friend, the trees blooming, something funny a roommate said that caused gutteral laughter that is good for the soul. And sometimes the best part of the day was a reminder that there is goodness in our broken world, and we are called to see it and share it.

Easter is coming and we will once again proclaim, Alleluia!



### MPC KIDS! FELLOWSHIP, PIZZA DINNER, CHILDREN'S CHOIR


After Easter, on April 12, MPC Kids will meet on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of each month from 5:30 - 6:30 pm.


### **REALM LOGIN AND MULTI-FACTOR AUTHENTICATION**







