



Nicholas House - At a time when we are aching to reach out to those on the margins most impacted by the COVID-19-related shutdowns, we hope that you will be able to participate in an online collection benefiting Nicholas House. With kids out of school and many parents working remotely or out of work indefinitely, these items will help families meet their needs during this unprecedented time. At **Intown Collaborative Ministries**, there is an increased need for food, so on Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday mornings, food and snack at ICM pick-up will be outside only, using 500 tote bags donated by MPC. The items most urgently needed are cereal, canned fruit, jelly, spaghetti sauce, canned potatoes, 16 oz bags of rice, and bottled water. ICM could also use chlorine bleach, hand sanitizer, sani-wipes, and rubbing alcohol. A drop-off table will be available outside McIver Hall (behind Druid Hills Presbyterian Church) Tuesdays and Fridays from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Please place items on the table in a single layer so the staff can sanitize them.
