Advent: 4 weeks or 40 weeks?

Advent is here! The season of waiting is upon us. Most years, I look forward to this season and revel in the anticipation and hopefulness of the season. But as Emma so poignantly pointed out in her sermon on Sunday, this pandemic has felt like one long extended Advent, and frankly, most of us are tired of waiting...to go out to dinner, to travel to see family, to go back to school, to worship in the sanctuary. Waiting has become synonymous with loss, distance, and isolation. It is certainly not a discipline most of us set out to hone more than the 4 weeks necessary to get to Christmas.

But waiting is a necessary practice in order for hope to spring forth and new life to occur. A normal human pregnancy is 40 weeks. Having had the pleasure of being pregnant twice, I can attest that by the $40^{\rm th}$ week, you will do literally anything to not be pregnant any longer. Perhaps this is an evolutionary necessity to get through childbirth. Perhaps it reveals a truth that we are more open to new life and the joys and challenges on the other side if the waiting has made us more than a wee-bit uncomfortable.

This year, our 40th week of pandemic/quarantine occurs the week of Christmas. We have literally been waiting long enough for God in human form to be Emmanuel, God-with-us. And the thing I have noticed is that these uncomfortable 40 weeks have trained our eyes to see God's presence in, around, and among us in the simplest gifts and the smallest gestures. Christmas will look different this year with less fanfare and frolicking, but perhaps after all this waiting, we will be even more attuned to see the ways God is present among us if we are willing to follow the star to the quiet, unnoticed corners of our community where new life still bursts forth. 


