

STEPPING OUT IN FAITH

We continue our commitment season sermon series, exploring how we set priorities as individuals and as a church. Together, we will tackle big questions: What can the



greatest commandment teach us about how we are to order our lives? What does it mean to 'take a leap of faith'? Can the faith of our ancestors help us persevere in the race set before us? What resources is required for us to journey together? What are we willing to give to make the kingdom visible?

HOLY PREPARATION ADVENT SERMON SERIES

In a season when we spend so much time and energy "decking the halls," what are we preparing for? When we're living on the other side of a global pandemic, does Advent invite ritual or does Advent call us to prepare for something new?

FAITH FORMATION

Beginning November 7, Michael Morgan will lead a three week Faith Formation series that explores the history of biblical publications, hymns and hymnals, and the role of Christmas music in the church's history.

NOVEMBER 7

"The First Generation of the English Bible: Wycliffe through King James"

We will explore the first English Bibles from the dawn of the Reformation through the publication of the King James Bible in 1611. There will be a display featuring original editions of all of the versions from John Wycliffe in 1380 to the mid-17th century, including the first 2 printings of the King James Version. You'll hear stories about the translators and other famous people involved in the production.

NOVEMBER 14

"We've a Story to Tell: The Christmas Saga and the English Bible"

We will turn back the clock and look at a number of renditions of the Christmas Story as it has been told in 500 years of English Bible history. Some are provocative and inspiring, while others are entertaining and humorous, yet they all remind us of the advent and birth of the Christ Child.

NOVEMBER 21

"Hark, the Herald Angels Sing: Advent and Christmas Psalms and Hymns"

For centuries we have not only read the Christmas Story in our English Bibles, but we have sung the poetic expressions of hymn writers over the years as they turned the prose into verse and added some of their own insights and imagery. Some will be the songs which are a vital part of our holiday experience, while some have not been sung since they were composed. Be sure to bring your voices with you to sing with anticipation and joy of the Nativity.







The console works, as those of you who attended worship or a memorial service heard these past two weeks. The organ committee is working now to finalize the process and cost of the "finishing touches" to ensure a console that will last us another 75 years. We will keep you updated on our continued work and progress, and we give thanks for prayers answered and patience required to continue the legacy of organ music at Morningside!
