Suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. -Romans 5:3-5



One of my favorite hymns begins, "O God, our help in ages past, our hope for years to come, our shelter from the stormy blast, and our eternal home." If there has ever been a season to consider where we put our hope, it is now. We are all wondering if we can put our hope in a vaccine? in a political candidate? in a mask? in a virtual platform for school? in the Instacart delivery service? in the YouTube premier for worship at 11am on a Sunday? As much as we try to place our hope in any of those things, our faith calls us to consider a deeper, more lasting hope made known in the love of Jesus Christ. As we look to Jesus, we recognize that his hope and love were not without challenge or suffering; his hope and love did not offer immediate gratification; his hope and love required our commitment toward acts of forgiveness, justice, and mercy. But Jesus' life, death, and resurrection showed that there was no power in this world in which love does not ultimately win. So we are invited in this commitment season to consider how we place our hope in God made known in Christ.

As we look to commitment season, the question I invite you to ponder is this:

Where will you put your hope?

One thing I have learned about the MPC family is that your put your time, talents, and treasures—your embodied hopes—in places where Jesus' love shines through, even in this dark and stormy time. This Month-at-a-Glance is overflowing with the ways you reflect your hope in God's love by sharing love with neighbors, friends, and those in need. Your generosity is present in your ongoing financial support through this time, to be sure. But those financial gifts keep on giving in our support of mission ministries across the city. They are embodied in our own opportunities for connection through affinity groups, Sunday school, outdoor study halls and MPC Kids! gatherings. They come to life online as we worship together virtually on Sunday mornings. They manifest themselves in church pen pals across generations, in flowers and meals shared, and in phone calls just to check-in. Where you put your time, talents, and treasure are emblematic of where you place your hope.

We cannot discern the future. I cannot tell you exactly when we will return to worship indoors or when coronavirus will go away. And I know that uncertainty can stir fear and anxiety in us. But this commitment season, I invite you to reflect on where you place your hope. Then, allow your life and your resources to flow in ways that lean into that hope and make it a reality. I, for one, am placing my hope in the only thing I have seen again and again to overcome fear, anxiety, hatred, and division: the love of Jesus Christ.

WHAT'S OUR NEXT STEP IN THE PANDEMIC?

For those tracking the data, you know that the Covid numbers across our state have improved dramatically in recent weeks. State-wide, our 7-day average positivity rate is down to 6.3% and we're under the 5% mark in Fulton and Dekalb counties. *Hallelujah!* As we live in hope for continued decline in cases, here's a reminder about what that means for us as a church:

We will move to Phase 2 when:

- We have <5% positive test rates for 21 days AND
- City and state officials allow groups of 50 or less to gather indoors

Phase 2 allows for small group gatherings with masks and distancing indoors as well as the possibility of 50 or less in the sanctuary with modifications for health and safety. The Session and ministry teams will discern the best way to live into that loosening of restrictions in a way that maintains the core values of MPC: a church that is welcoming, hospitable, and inclusive for all. Rest assured that even when limited in-person activity resumes, we will continue to make online engagement our primary way of gathering until all can safely return together. This is an ever-evolving situation for our community and we will continue to track the data should our situation change. 






DOBBS ELEMENTARY

- Dobbs Elementary namesake, James Wesley Dobbs, believed that the power of the ballot was key in overcoming segregation. When Mr. Dobbs started his registration drives in 1936, less than 600 blacks were registered to vote in Atlanta. His goal was to register 10,000 people, but after a record breaking 20,000 voters were registered, Mayor Hartsfield kept his promise and several of Mr. Dobbs' goals were reached- including the first black Atlanta police officers. John Wesley Dobbs died on the evening of the day the Atlanta School System was desegregated. His grandson, Maynard Jackson, Jr. became the first black mayor of Atlanta.


