Your Session continues to engage in leading the church forward in ways big and small. This month, the Session engaged prayerfully in the strategic work of preparing us for the next season:

- Finance is working with mission teams to begin preparing the 2022 budget.
- Commitment is planning ways to engage the whole congregation in taking the next steps on our journey together with Christ
- Officer Nominating Committee is prayerfully discerning who God is calling as the next class of elders and deacons
- Fellowship is finalizing plans for the All Church Retreat
- Worship and Arts is looking ahead to Advent and Christmas and continues to seek volunteers to help the many parts of worship run smoothly
- Facilities has been hard at work preparing for a new flat roof to be installed, exploring improved sanctuary lighting, and working to keep our building in tip-top shape
- Children's and Youth ministries are actively restarting programs to help our youngest members grow, learn, and play together.

- Hosted 5 Little Monkeys Consignment Sale and welcomed hundreds of parents to our campus, free advertising for MPCKids! and MPP
- Rejoiced that our \$10K financial support of Memorial Drive Ministries raised >\$10,000 in matching funds to enable them to repair the kitchen and complete other capital upgrades after a recent fire

### BRAHMS' GERMAN REQUIEM

Join us October 31 for All Saints Sunday as we remember those who have passed from this life into the next. The Chancel Choir continues in the tradition of leading worshipers through a large portion of a requiem within the service. This year, the choir will present 4 of the 7 movements from *Ein Deutsches Requiem* ("A German Requiem") by Johannes Brahms, sung in German. Composed 1865 and 1868, Brahms used sacred, but not liturgical texts. Brahms did not use the traditional Catholic/Latin requiem words, rather drew from passages from the German Luther Bible. Instead of imploring God to watch over those departed, Brahms's texts beseech God to bring comfort to the living. Join us and rest in the beautiful music and texts of this requiem.


