
WORLD COMMUNION SUNDA PEACE & GLOBAL WITNESS

MPC participates in World Communion Sunday on October 2 and will take up the Peace & Global Witness Offering, which enables the church to promote the peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. Individual congregations are encouraged to utilize up to 25% of this Offering to connect with the global witness of Christ's peace. Mid councils retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The remaining 50% is used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness.

WHY I GIVE TO MORNINGSIDE: A REFLECTION BY SUSAN ODER

When I was very young, I would spend Saturday nights at my Grandparents' house in Nashville and go to Sunday School and Worship with them the next morning at Woodland Presbyterian Church. One of my earliest recollections is standing with other five- and six-year-old children at a Mission Dinner in Fellowship Hall and singing "Jesus Loves the Little Children". You know the words....."Red and yellow, black and white, they are precious in His sight ..."

This was in the early '50s and Nashville was on the cusp of being at the forefront of racial demonstrations and sit-ins in the Civil Rights movement. Two to three years later, I had become an avid reader and would devour anything I could get my hands on, including both the morning and afternoon newspapers. Each covered the actions and treatment of demonstrating students. The pictures showed nicely dressed people of color sitting at downtown lunch counters ordering a hamburger or soda and being screamed and yelled at, having things thrown at them and, in some instances, being hit and dragged off their seats.

As a child in an upper middle-class home, I had been taught that this was not acceptable behavior — unless, that is, it was being used against folks of color. I had been around Black people who worked for my family and my friends' families and was very fond of many of them. At the same time, I knew how adults referred to them behind their backs. This saddened me greatly. I knew that many of them were very smart ... after all, they could beat me at cards, and I was already a card shark!

So, how did I reconcile the song I learned at church and talk I heard at my home and my friends' homes about people who didn't look like me? As the '50s turned into the turbulent '60s, I turned to the same thing that had comforted generations before me, the lessons I learned at church. Those lessons of love and respect and equality are the same ones we teach at MPC so that our children can continue to help make the world a better place for everyone, Red and yellow, black and white. Straight or gay, Rich or poor. We're still moving forward, even after seventy years. Generation to Generation. To continue that forward progress, please remember that your contributions of time, talent and treasure are vital to keep our young people learning to be disciples in today's fragmented society.




BLESSING OF THE PETS

FACILITIES UPDATE




Take a walk in God's creation on our campus this week! Thanks to the efforts of eight handy church members, our bridge now has brand new decking. Come check it out!





Selai was born and raised in Vunidogoloa, the first Fijian community that was forced to relocate due to the impact of climate change. Since 2014, the island nation of Fiji has had roughly four such relocations, including Selai's home. According to Frances Namoumou, the Ecological Stewardship and Climate Justice program coordinator for the Pacific Conference of Churches (PCC), the churches of the Pacific have envisioned worstcase scenarios, in which an alarming number of communities, just like Vunidogoloa, will have to relocate if the effects of climate change are not mitigated. The catastrophic impact of the Pacific islands' cyclone season is a further contributing factor to the mounting number of necessary climate relocations. Frances says that it is the vital support from the PCUSA's Peace & Global Witness offering that makes it possible for these communities to survive.

The PCC's call to peacemaking, including addressing the growing mental health concerns displaced families suffer as a result from the impact of climate change, is made possible by gifts to the Peace & Global Witness Offering, traditionally received on World Communion Sunday, which this year falls on Sunday, October 2. Give during Sunday Worship or via Realm.


S.O.S. AMANI WOMEN'S CENTER SAVE OUR SISTERS INITIATIVE
