Maybe you want to learn skills to apply this in your home through the love and logic parenting class. Maybe you want to check out a book from the Matthew 25 library and consider the role of forgiveness as we address systemic racism. Or maybe Lent will be a personal journey for you as you consider a particular relationship or circumstance that might require you to seek or offer forgiveness.

However you choose to observe this Lent, I invite you to commit to a practice that will help you encounter God's grace by naming our need for forgiveness.




