# ART IN WORSHIP: CONTEMPLATING THE CROSS BY MYLES SMITH

God invites us to worship and to reflection using all of our senses. So much of our worship is experienced through hearing. This Lent, we were blessed to add a visual art component to our worship. Myles Smith offered reflections on the cross through art. We hope that his contribution helped you to reflect further on what the cross means to you and where you find hope amidst despair and life amidst death. Below is the final piece from Myles Smith's Lenten art installation, which had two sides.

## *Shroud*

Linen, wire, concrete, acrylic paint

This cross is made of linen dipped in concrete set against a black background. It represents the time between the crucifixion and resurrection. It is shrouded in black awaiting the day of resurrection in which all things are made new through Christ.

Joseph of Arimathea went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then he took it down, wrapped it in a linen cloth, and laid it in a rock-hewn tomb where no one had ever been laid. It was the day of Preparation, and the sabbath was beginning.

Luke 23: 52-54.



## *He Is Risen*

Linen, wire, concrete, acrylic paint

The dogwood blossoms come from a twentieth century American legend that says the original cross was made of wood from the dogwood tree. After the crucifixion, Jesus transformed the trees into a twisted, compact plant so that it could never again be used for execution. According to the story, on the day of resurrection all the dogwoods of the forest bloomed in joy. Look closely at a dogwood blossom and you will see that they bear rusty marks on the petals signifying the nails and surround a center that wears a crown.

Mozil just turned 6 years old and is enrolled and thriving at Indian Creek Elementary. Mother, Naeem and little brother, Adil love practicing English along with Mozil and his flashcards. The International Rescue Committee was able to secure the family a 3-month free rent extension, through July.
