As we journey together through this Easter season, my invitation to you is to find a way to connect with someone in a different age and stage of life than you. Maybe you're sitting near a new member and haven't gotten acquainted yet. Maybe you're a new member and curious about the history of a particular mission of the church. When we begin to share our faith and tell one another stories of where God is at work in our lives, we can feel how the church is alive! May your lives be enriched by one another and may God bless us as we grow together.

Sweetwater Creek State Park is a peaceful tract of wilderness in Lithia Springs. Please join us in May 18th when we will hike to the five-story New Manchester mill ruins alongside the white-water rapids of Sweetwater Creek. New Manchester was a mid-nineteenth century mill town which met its demise during the Civil War. This trail is the most frequently used trail in the park because it's the shortest trail to the mill ruins and best showcases the beauty of the creek valley. It is a relatively easy 2 mile hike.
