# MATTHEW 25 EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY

We at Morningside Presbyterian sometimes don't realize how fortunate we are. However, our commitment as a Matthew 25 church is to learn about structural racism so that we can respond in more just ways as disciples today. If you want to experience what travel was like for African Americans in the Jim Crow South, you can do so by visiting **The Negro Motorist Green Book Exhibit at the Jimmy Carter Library** from March 30 to June 23. The exhibit is kid friendly, and the cost of the exhibit is included in the \$10 admission fee to the Carter Center. Created in 1936 by Victor Green and published through 1967, The Green Book was an Indispensable guide to hotels, motels, restaurants, tourist homes, department stores and gas stations for African Americans who wished to travel safely when "sundown towns" explicitly prohibited them from staying overnight.

Developed by the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibit Service, the exhibit includes artifacts from the period, including business signs and postcards, home movies and personal reflections as well as an interactive exhibit. While the exhibit reveals the dangers of travel, it also demonstrates the resilience of people determined to visit new sites or visit family.




