
# MONTH AT AGLANCE Each evening around the dinner table, my family shares "thankfuls." No matter what kind of a day



2024 COMMITMENT SEASON




We are hopeful that with your help, we can meet the goal of \$850,000 from 165 households this year. If you were not able to worship with us on Sunday, can we count you in?


