Clifton Sanctuary Ministries' footprint has expanded as they continue to partner with Intown Cares to provide comprehensive and intensive case management for Clifton guests. Clifton's Case Management service, provided within their Night Hospitality program, is at the core of the successful outcomes of their guests.

- Each guest who comes to Clifton is given an Individual Service Plan (ISP) to help achieve his goal of self-sufficiency and independent living.
- Each guest explains what led to his homelessness and the goals he seeks to achieve.
- The Case Manager then develops a plan that will help enable each guest to accomplish his goals. CSM's assertive Case Management and goal-focused intake process to create ISPs help to provide the foundation for our guests' transformation.
