



REAUTHORIZE THE FARM BILL!

The PC(USA)'s Office of Public Witness issued an Action Alert Tuesday encouraging Presbyterians to, among other things, urge their U.S. Senators and House of Representatives member to quickly reauthorize the five-year Farm Bill, which expires in 2023 and provides Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program and other anti-hunger initiatives to millions of residents as well as support to the nation's two million farmers.

In addition to writing legislators to prioritize anti-hunger programs in the 2023 Farm Bill, Presbyterians and other people of faith can pray for farmers, transporters, consumers and for those who benefit from government nutrition benefits, the Action Alert states. They can also educate themselves using resources including the "Eater's Guide to the Farm Bill," which was produced by Food in Neighborhoods and the Presbyterian Hunger Program and can be read here.
